Dear Parents and Carers,

I am pleased to share with you, as part of our PSHE curriculum; the children will be attending a Choices and Consequences workshop at the National Galleries of Justice.

The National Galleries of Justice provide an award winning anti-knife crime prevention workshops for key stage 2 upwards, specifically aimed at young people who are unlikely to have considered carrying a knife. Working in partnership with the Ben Kinsella Trust, Choices and Consequences is proven to encourage positive behaviours and attitudes against carrying knives.

The exhibition focusses on the themes of consequences and choices and we discuss knife crime, joint enterprise and staying safe. The children will learn about the dangers of carrying a knife, the consequences of carrying and associating with those carrying knives, the law and how it applies to knife crime cases, the realities of prison life, making positive choices to stay safe and making safe decisions when it comes to good friends. They will be immersed in different learning styles by having films, posters, pictures and comics, group discussion, written tasks, an actor who performs a monologue and Q and A's.

Due to number restrictions, each class will attend the workshop separately with their class teacher.

Finches will attend the workshop on Tuesday 8th October 2024, 9am-12.00pm

Puffins will attend the workshop on Wednesday 9th October 2024, 9am-12pm

As the trip is during school hours, all children should be in normal school uniform.

There will not be a charge for this workshop but we do need your permission to take your child off site. Please can you give consent via the school gateway app.
