

## Pupil Premium Summary of Spend 2017 – 2018

In 2011-2012 the Government launched its Pupil Premium Funding. This money is given to schools based on the number of pupils in the school who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM).

In September 2017, Cloudside Academy was allocated £136, 800 for this academic year to support pupil premium children (those who have been entitled at some point to Free School Meals over the last 6 years). Pupil premium children make up 30% of the pupils at Cloudside, this is above the national average.

Our analysis has found that individual and small group tuition focused on literacy and numeracy, whilst building self-esteem through enriched experiences such as nurture and educational visits has a significant impact on pupils' achievement. Regular attendance and parental involvement are also crucial to children's academic success.
