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Maths

White Rose Maths are providing daily lessons, where your child can watch a video which demonstrates the new learning. During the video, your child will be asked to pause at certain points to try and answer questions while the task is being modelled. The video is clear and well-paced to support your child with their understanding. Besides each video, there is an activity sheet which can be downloaded and your child can complete it on the computer or if you would prefer and you have access to a printer they can be printed off. These resources are in line with what we follow as a school. These are all available at any time and there are already 4 weeks of lessons available. We recommend that you start with the first week, unless you have already completed it.

English

Jane Considine is providing free live lessons on sentence stacking.

At 9:30, a short video clip will be available to watch, which she calls the film focus. At 10:30 the writing task will be modelled. We recommend that you begin with the first week and submit your child's responses. If you do start from the beginning, then you do not need to follow the timings as they are older videos. Your child's class teacher will then provide feedback but will also merge the sentences created by the whole class together to make a class story based on the film focus. These will then be shared with the class.

When you select the week that you would like to use e.g. Super Sentence Stacking - The Blue Umbrella - Session 1, underneath the video you can gain access to the video link and the chunking of the video, where your child will select their chosen part of the video to focus on. The video is split into chunks and your child can pick their favourite part (chunk) of the story. During the 10:30 writing task, Jane will support your child with creating a sentence.

Session 1- introducing the film and encouraging the children to select a chunk of the video that they liked.

Session 2- Learn the rules of the task, what your three writing challenges are and then complete the 9 sentences.

Session 3- celebrating sentences that have been submitted at 12:30

Session 4- Jane shares the final story, which is a collaboration of some of the sentences sent in by children.

Reading

We advise that your child reads as regularly as possible. This can be any genre or reading stimulus. First News, who we subscribe to as a school, are providing free access to the children during the school closure period. So your child can keep up to date with current affairs via the link: <https://subscribe.firstnews.co.uk/free-downloadable-issue/>. We are also encouraging the continued use of Myon and quizzing on Accelerated Reader. There is an option to read short 60 second reads to support reading little and often.

Wider Curriculum
